THE ROLE

Whilst sitting within the Partnerships (Fundraising) Team, you'll be a vital asset across the board, working alongside colleagues in communications, facilities and youth work.

It will be your responsibility to support the Partnerships team, contributing to the achievement of the income generation strategy and targets across a range of approaches including; major donors, corporate supporters, events and in particular grants and trusts. Your focus will also be on inspiring and supporting young people themselves to raise funds and support for their Youth Zone.

Your work will aid the continuous improvement of Inspire's offer providing the necessary funds to maintain essential and proven work as well as enable new initiatives in response to the needs and wishes of young people.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Preparing and submitting grant applications to charitable trusts
- Stewardship of grant funders, collation of reports and developing excellent relationships, leading to repeat funding
- Researching potential funding prospects. Are they a good fit? At what level could they support?
- Point of contact for 3rd party fundraising, e.g. companies raising funds for Inspire via sponsored events or similar

- Organisation of events, e.g. business breakfasts, potential supporter "Seeing is Believing" open evenings
- Assist with **tours** of Inspire
- Involving young people in fundraising
- Liaison with comms team to ensure that the Partnership team's work is underpinned by relevant comms
- Administrative support for the wider partnerships team
- Comply with all policies and procedures

THE ESSENTIALS

This role is an **ideal entry point** to a career in the fundraising sector which offers significant opportunities for career progression.

It is not necessary to have specific fundraising experience but you must be able to evidence and demonstrate attributes which will enable you to learn and succeed in the role.

First and foremost we are looking for someone with a "can do" and results driven approach.

Additionally, we are looking for:

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills - the key to success in this role
- The ability to quickly build rapport with potential supporters – you only have one chance to make a good first impression
- Strong organisational skills with excellent attention to detail at all times
- The ability to clearly and concisely present key messages
